Growing in Faith as a Family

Every Catholic parent made a promise at their child's baptism: to bring them up in the practice of the faith. One of the most powerful ways to do this is through regular Sunday Mass attendance as a family.

The Eucharist is the centre of our Catholic life — it feeds us, strengthens us, and unites us. Bringing children, even little ones, to Mass helps them grow naturally into the rhythm of prayer and worship.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy is a special part of the Mass where children hear the Sunday readings and Gospel explained in age-appropriate ways through story, creative activities, and prayer (sometimes called *Godly Play*). These sessions help children grow in their understanding of the faith and are an important step in their Catholic formation.



At baptism, Catholic parents promise to bring their children up in the practice of the faith, and regular Mass attendance is a vital part of this. Children's Liturgy helps make that possible by giving children a chance to engage actively in the liturgy, while parents participate in the main celebration of the Mass.

Children's Liturgy is open to all children who are able to go out with the youth leaders, up to and including those preparing for First Holy Communion.

Helping and Volunteering: A Role for Parents

Children's Liturgy is made possible entirely through the dedication of volunteer catechists and youth leaders — and there's no one better suited for this than parents!

Parents are often the best leaders and role models in this setting, as they already understand the needs, attention spans, and spiritual

curiosity of children. Whether you have experience or are simply willing to learn, we would love you to come along, see a session in action, and consider joining the team.

New helpers are always welcome, and full support and training will be offered. It's a rewarding way to deepen your own faith while helping children grow in theirs.

Youth in Action – Encourage your child to get involved!

Has your child made their First Holy Communion? Whether recently or some years ago, now is a wonderful time to encourage them to take a more active part in our parish family. Volunteering helps young people live out their faith, grow in confidence, and discover their gifts.

There are many ministries open to children and young people, such as:

- Altar Serving
- Music Ministry
- Reading at Mass
- Welcoming (with you as parents)
- Helping at Children's Liturgy
- ... and more!

Perhaps your child is joining a Confirmation group this year, planning to in the future, or has already been confirmed and is looking to deepen their journey of faith. Serving in the parish is an excellent way for them to strengthen their spiritual understanding while giving something back.

Volunteering can also contribute towards the **Duke of Edinburgh Award** or the **Faith in Action Award**, making it a valuable experience for both faith and personal growth.

Please take some time to talk with your child about where they might feel called to serve — and if they are interested and able, speak to your priest or a member of the church team for further details.

First Reconciliation & First Holy Communion 2025/2026 – A beautiful step in faith

First Holy Communion is one of the most special moments in a child's faith journey — when they receive Jesus in the Eucharist for the very first time. Along with the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), it marks a joyful and grace-filled stage in growing closer to God and becoming more fully part of the Church. This preparation is for baptised Catholic children in Year 3 and above, and it's not just about learning facts — it's about discovering the love of Jesus, learning how to pray, and becoming more aware of God's presence in everyday life.

Families are encouraged to attend Sunday Mass regularly, as this helps children grow into the rhythm of faith and feel at home in the worshipping community. Parents also play a vital role throughout the programme by supporting their child's prayer and understanding at home.

If you have a child who is ready to take this step, we invite you to register for your church's First Communion programme. It's a beautiful opportunity for the whole family to grow in faith together.

Confirmation 2025/2026 – Say Yes to the Holy Spirit

Confirmation is one of the great Sacraments of the Church — a moment when young people are strengthened by the Holy Spirit to live their faith with confidence, courage, and purpose.

For baptised Catholics, Confirmation is not just a "next step" — it's a personal "Yes" to the gifts received at Baptism. It deepens their relationship with God and prepares them to live as adult Christians in the world.

Young people preparing for Confirmation should already be attending Mass regularly and have a willingness to explore their faith more fully. The preparation journey

is not just about learning — it's about growing in relationship with Jesus, discovering what it means to be part of the Church, and being open to the grace and power of the Holy Spirit.



If you have a child who is in Year 10 or above, now is the time to consider enrolling them in this year's preparation programme. It's a chance to ask big questions, grow in faith, and step more deeply into the life God is calling them to.

A combined programme runs in the Parish's West Hub:

- Lumen Christi – Deadline: Friday 3 October (Year 9 children may also be accepted subject to discernment)

Programmes running in the Parish's East Hub:

- St Mary Magdalene Bexhill and St Martha's Little Common – Deadline: Friday 10 October
- St Thomas of Canterbury & the English Matyrs and Holy Redeemer St Leonards and St Mary Star of the Sea Hastings – Deadline: Friday 19 September
- Our Lady Immaculate & St Michael and St Teresa of Lisieux: Please speak to Fr Richard who will direct you to join the St Leonards programme – Deadline: Friday 19 September

Becoming a Catholic

Interested in becoming Catholic or completing your sacraments?

RCIA – The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The RCIA is the process by which adults are welcomed into the Catholic Church. It's for anyone who is:

- Not baptised, but interested in exploring the Catholic faith
- Baptised in another Christian tradition, and wishes to become Catholic
- Baptised Catholic, but never received First Communion or Confirmation

This journey is not a course or class in the usual sense — it's a time of discovery, prayer, and personal reflection. You'll have the chance to learn more about the Catholic faith, ask questions, and grow in relationship with God in a supportive, welcoming environment.

Many parents begin this journey because they want to understand their child's faith more deeply, or because they were never Confirmed and feel called to take the next step.

If you're curious, interested, or feel a gentle nudge to find out more, we warmly invite you to speak to your parish priest. There's no pressure — just a chance to explore what God might be saying to you at this moment in your life.

Two new Saints for young people

We're thrilled to share that two young people were canonised as saints on 7 September in Rome — a joyful moment for the whole Church, especially for children and teenagers!

St Carlo Acutis (1991–2006) was a tech-loving teen who created a website about Eucharistic miracles before dying of leukaemia at 15.

St Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901–1925) was an adventurous, mountain-climbing, faith-filled young man who served the poor and lived the Beatitudes with joy.

These saints remind us that young people can be holy too — right now, in ordinary life.
